KEY VOTING DATES

Early Voting

OCTOBER 15-31

Register and vote at any early voting site in your county!

Election Day

NOVEMBER 3

Vote at your assigned polling place from 6:30 am-7:30 pm!

Voter Registration Deadline: Oct 9 @ 5 pm

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WHO CAN VOTE?

If you are a U.S. citizen, **AND** you are 18+ years old on Election Day, **AND** you have lived at your NC address for 30+ days before Election Day, **AND** you are **NOT** currently serving a felony sentence, including probation or parole – **YOU CAN VOTE!**



WHAT TO BRING?

The address on your voter registration **does NOT** have to match the one on your ID.

Unexpired or expired for one year or less:

- NC driver license or DMV issued ID
- US passport or passport card
- NC student ID* or NC government ID*
- FREE ID from county board of elections
- Out-of-state driver license only if voter registers within 90 days of the election

***Some restrictions apply.**

Regardless of expiration:

- US military or veteran ID
- Tribal ID
- ID card from a US or NC government public assistance program

Over 65? ID is valid if it was unexpired on the voter's 65th birthday.

NO ID? Ask for the Exception Form



SAME-DAY REGISTRATION
